Prior to the shortage, many motorists chose to bypass certain petrol stations in favour of others, whose prices they considered to be more favourable.


Despite an increase in fuel costs, motorists are now content to wait in line for prolonged periods of time, in the hope that when their turn



arrives, they will be afforded the opportunity to place some fuel in their tank. With rations in place and upper limit sanctions applied, those with large capacity tanks are unable to fill them, but may only purchase a portion of what they require. As followers of Christ, we will never be presented with a sign that informs us He is not available, due to experiencing low capacity issues. The Apostle Paul reminds us: 'And my God shall supply all your need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus.' Philippians 4:19 (NKJV). We serve a God whose resources are limitless and can never be depleted! To those who honour the Lord: 'then your barns will be filled to overflowing, and your vats will brim over with new wine.' Proverbs 3:10 (NIV).

As His children, there will never be a time that we call on Him and He responds that we must wait in line while He deals with an issue that is more urgent than ours. When we call on Him to fill us, He will never turn us away half full, but will fill us until we overflow. We read in Matthew 5:6: 'Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.' (Christian Standard Bible). Jesus has given us who are His children this assurance: "I am the bread of life. He who comes to Me shall never hunger, and he who believes in Me shall never thirst." John 6:35 (NKJV).
