They immediately left their nets and followed Him.



In John's Gospel he records that Jesus said: "Whoever serves Me must follow Me; and where I am, My servant also will be. My Father will honor the one who serves Me." John 12:26 (NIV).

In the Gospel of Matthew, we read that after the birth of Jesus, wise men sought to find Him so that they could worship Him, having proclaimed that they had "seen His star in the East" (Matthew 2:2).

The wise men are a great example of faith and obedience in action. Nowhere do we read that one of them suggested an optimal route, or demonstrated a desire to race ahead, convinced that the star was not a reliable guide as they had heard a rumour that Christ had been seen in another town; they diligently followed '...and behold, the star which they had seen in the East went before them, till it came and stood over where the young Child was.' Matthew 2:9 (NKJV).

Jesus said: "I am the light of the world." He also promised: "He who



follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but have the light of life." John 8:12 (NKJV).

Today, there are those who will proudly declare: "I'm a believer", but will not take the step to transition from believer to follower of Christ.

Perhaps we might consider another reason why the wise men are said to be wise? More than simply believing that the star would lead them to Christ, they put their belief into action and chose to follow; will you?
