

As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace:



"I knew you had it in you!" Perhaps you have been encouraged to hear similar words said to you on accomplishing a feat that at first you deemed unlikely. As many of us are all too often our own greatest critic, it is wonderful to have those around us who are willing to encourage us to be everything that God has created us to be.

The time has come for each of us to work out (exercise as opposed to figure-out), what God has placed within us. God has impregnated us with precious seed (unique talents and gifts), which we must nurture and allow to grow within us. In due season, we must give birth to what we have been carrying, so that God's name may be glorified and a waiting world blessed by our fruit.

Working out (exercising) what is within us takes effort! It requires an intentionality and a desire to have a closer relationship with Jesus; reading and listening to His Word, learning how to recognise His voice and resolving to quickly obey His instructions.



The Apostle Paul encourages us concerning the various gifts that our Heavenly Father has placed within us: Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, let us prophesy in proportion to our faith; or ministry, let us use it in our ministering; he who teaches, in teaching; he who exhorts, in exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness. Romans 12:6-8 (NKJV).
