Thought for today...


In 1965, the English rock band The Beatles released a single entitled 'Help!'. They sang: "I need somebody, (Help) not just anybody, (Help) you know I need someone, help..."

In the Gospel of Luke (Luke 10:25-37), we read the parable of the Good Samaritan. Jesus tells of a man who, travelling from Jerusalem to Jericho, fell among thieves, who stripped him of his clothing, wounded him, and departed, leaving him half dead. A priest and also a Levite, on

seeing the man, passed by on the other

side.

But a Samaritan, as he journeyed, came to where the wounded man was, and when he saw him, he had compassion. He went to him, bandaged his wounds set him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. The next day, he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said to him, "Take care of him; and whatever more you spend, when I come again, I will repay you." A laudable act? More so, given that Samaritans were despised by Jews.




Jesus said "And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. This is the first commandment. And the second, like it, is this: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." Mark 12:30-31 (NKJV).
